

Birth:

David was born July 12, 1758, at Longmeadow, Hampden County, Massachusetts. David Calvin Warner [Sr.] was the son of Jesse Warner Sr. and his 2nd wife, the widow Mary (Cooley) Ven Horn.

147a\David Warner, b. at Longmeadow or Springfield, July 12, 1758 (Springfield town records); moved to Phelps, Orleans County, N. Y., before his brother Jesse, then to Wayne County, N. Y., and is said to have removed later to Michigan. In 1794 he was called of Warrensburg, N. Y. (Warren County). Married Mary Russell.

Compiler's note: There is no evidence that he moved to Michigan.

Enlistment:

January 19, 1777 - David enlisted for 3 years in Captain Ephraim Cleaveland's Company of the Massachusetts Regiment of Foot commanded by Colonel Michael Jackson.

WARNER, DAVID, Ashuelot Equivalent (also given Partridgefield). Return of men raised to serve in the Continental Army from Capt. Zebulon Norton's co.; residence, Ashuelot Equivalent; engaged for Ashuelot Equivalent; joined Capt. Cleaveland's co., Col. Jackson's regt.; also, Private, Capt. Ephraim Cleaveland's co., Col. Michael Jackson's regt.; Continental Army pay accounts for service from Jan. 15, 1777, to July 15, 1778; residence, Partridgefield; reported deserted.

July 22, 1778 – Muster roll taken at Greenwich for June 1777 of Captain Ephraim Cleaveland's Company of the Massachusetts Regiment of Foot commanded by Colonel Michael Jackson lists David Warner as a Private who enlisted for 3 years of service.

June 1779 – David Warner, a private in Captain Ephraim Cleaveland's Company, Colonel Michael Jackson's 8th Regiment who enlisted January 19, 1777, is listed as having deserted this date.

August 17, 1782 - U.S., Revolutionary War Rolls, 1775-1783, Massachusetts Various Organizations (Folder 91) 8th and/or 9th Regiment – Descriptive List dated at West Point - David Warner – Age 22; 5'-9"; a farmer; born in Massachusetts; from Partridgefield, Berkshire County; dark hair; light complexion; Enlisted January 19, 1777 for 3 years; deserted June 1779.

Not Dated – David Warner, a private in Captain Ephraim Cleaveland's Company, Colonel Michael Jackson's Battalion is listed on a roll as being in the hospital.

Pay Information:

None was found.

Before the War:

Sometime before the Revolution, David's father Jesse-4 and his family moved to Berkshire County, MA, and settled in the area known successively as Ashuelot Equivalent, Dalton, and then as Hinsdale.

During the War:

January 9, 1779 – David married Mary Russell at Conway, Franklin, Massachusetts who was born November 20, 1754, at Windsor, Hartford County, Connecticut and died April 21, 1846 (aged 91) at Albion, Calhoun County, Michigan. They had 13 children: Wareham, Polly who married Asa Adams, Lucinda who married Enos Pembroke, Sr., Lucretia who died 1803, David Calvin, Anna who married Richard Church III, Russell, Stephen, Elizabeth "Betsey" who married David Johnson, Harriet who married Sylvester Rice, Sr., Elihu, John, and Luther.

After the War:

1790 Federal Census for Stephentown, Albany County, New York lists a David Warner residence with 1 free white male 16 and over, 3 free white males under 16, and 5 free white females.

1794 – David was residing in Warrensburg, Warren County, New York.

1800 Federal Census for Northampton, Ontario County, New York lists a David Warner residence with three free white males under 10, 2 free white males 10 -15, 1 free white male 26 – 44, 2 free white females under 10, 1 free white female 10 – 15, 1 free white female 16 – 25, 1 free white female 26 – 44, and 1 free white female 45 and older.

? Moved to Phelps, Ontario County, New York.

1804 - New York, U.S., Tax Assessment Rolls of Real and Personal Estates, 1799-1804 for David Warner of Phelps, Ontario, New York, USA – Real estate value \$845 – Personal Property Value - \$243 – Total \$1088 – Tax \$2.97.

? Moved to Wayne County, New York.

1810 Federal Census for Palmyra, Ontario (now Wayne) County, New York lists a David Warner residence with two free white males 10 – 15, 1 free white male 16 – 25, 1 free white male 45 and over, 2 free white females 10 – 15, 1 free white female 16 – 25, and 2 free white females 45 and over.

1820 Federal Census for Palmyra, Ontario (now Wayne) County, New York lists a David Warner residence with two free white males 10 – 15, 3 free white males 16 – 25, 1 free white male 45 and over, 1 free white female under 10, 2 free white females 16 – 25, 1 free white female 26 – 44 and 1 free white colored male under 14. Four people were reported as being engaged in agriculture.

1830 Federal Census for Macedon, Wayne County, New York lists a David Warner residence with one free white male 50 – 59, 1 free white female 10 – 14, 1 free white female 15 – 19, and 1 free white female 40 – 49.

Death:

David died April 16, 1831 (aged 72) at Walworth, Wayne County, New York and buried in Baker Cemetery, Walworth, Wayne County, New York.
