

**Birth:**

Ebenezer was born in Massachusetts in 1766.

**Enlistment:**

Ebenezer enlisted as a private into the Continental Service in March 1781 for 3 years in Captain Thomas Francis' company of the 10<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Regiment commanded by Colonel Tupper.

**Service Information:**

January 1, 1782 – 12 months service in Col. Benjamin Tupper's (10<sup>th</sup>) Regiment

Served in Lt. Colonel Calvin Smith's (6<sup>th</sup>) Regiment, Captain Matthew Chamber's Company

1782 - 10<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Regiment consolidated into the 6<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Regiment commanded by Colonel Tupper, Captain Simon Jackson's company.

Close of the War (1783) – Again, Ebenezer's regiment was consolidated into the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regiment (under the same Captain) commanded by Colonel Sprout.

January 1784 – Ebenezer was honorably discharged by General Jackson with 2 years and 9 months service.

**Payment Information:**

Return for Wages for December 1782 - Lt. Colonel Calvin Smith's (6<sup>th</sup>) Regiment. Captain Matthew Chamber's Company – Ebenezer was allowed 1 month.

**After the War:**

Ebenezer lived in the Town of Westfield, Massachusetts

1790 Federal Census for Boston, Suffolk County, Massachusetts lists an Ebenezer Still residence with 1 free white male 16 and older and 2 free white females.

1800 Federal Census for Northfield (now Pittsford), Ontario (now Monroe) County, New York has an Ebenezer Still residence with 2 free white males under 10, 1 free white male 26 – 44, 2 free white females under 10, and 1 free white female 16-25.

Per Find-a-Grave, Ebenezer came to Macedon about 1800 from Windsor, Massachusetts, bringing his wife and 4 children who were born in Massachusetts. He resided in Walworth.

January 1807 – Ebenezer purchased the southeast corner of Lot 56 from Jonathen Warner, where Macedon Center is now located.

1810 Federal Census for Palmyra (then including Macedon), Ontario (now Wayne) County, New York has an Ebenezer Still residence with 3 free white males under 10, 3

free white males 10 – 15, 1 free white male 45 and older, 7 free white females under 10, 1 free white female 10 -15, 1 free white female 16-25, and 1 free white female 26 – 44.

Ebenezer and his wife Susannah had 12 children after arriving in Macedon Center. Two of the children died as infants.

April 14, 1818 - Ebenezer was living in Palmyra (which at that time included Macedon), Ontario (now Wayne) County, NY when he made his first pension affidavit.

1820 Federal Census for Palmyra (then including Macedon), Ontario (now Wayne) County, New York has an Ebenezer Still residence with 3 free white males under 10, 1 free white male 10 – 15, 1 free white male 16 – 18, 2 white males 16 – 21, 1 free white male 45 and over, 2 free white females under 10, 1 free white female 10 – 15, and 1 free white female 26 – 44. 3 individuals involved in agriculture.

1830 Federal Census for Macedon, Wayne County, New York has an Ebenezer Still residence with 1 free white male 10 – 14, 1 free white male 15 – 19, 1 free white male 20 – 29, 1 free white male 60 – 69, 2 free white females 15 -19, and 1 free white female 50 – 59.

The Pension Roll of 1835 has Ebenezer residing in Wayne County, New York. He served as a private of the Massachusetts Continental Line. He was initially given a pension of \$96 per year under the Act of March 18, 1818, effective April 14, 1818, and placed on the Rolls September 30, 1818. He was dropped from the Roll under the Act of May 1, 1820. He was pensioned again under the Act of June 7, 1832, receiving \$80 per year beginning March 4, 1831, and placed on the Rolls December 20, 1832. Pension paid through September 1847.

1840 Federal Census for Macedon, Wayne County, New York has an Ebenezer Still residence in Macedon, Wayne County, NY with 1 free white male 60 -69 and 1 free white female 50 – 59.

His widow, Susannah, received a widow's pension commencing February 8, 1848, of \$80 per year, paid through September 1850.

### **Death:**

Ebenezer died Feb. 8, 1848, at Macedon, NY. He is buried in the West Walworth Cemetery, Walworth, Wayne County, NY.
